San Diego was fortunate to receive a visit this month from U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Secretary Julián Castro, who got a firsthand look at one of the San Diego Housing Commission's

(SDHC) newest partnership developments and then spoke at a conference on ending homelessness.

I would also like to share some information with you on a meeting in Washington, D.C., of public housing agencies which participate in HUD's "Moving to Work" program.

SDHC Partnership – HUD Secretary Julián Castro tours COMM22

HUD Secretary Julián Castro toured the SDHC affordable housing development partnership COMM22 during a visit to San Diego on February 20, calling it "truly a model of what we would like to see in communities across the United States."

SDHC – Moving to Work Conference in Washington, D.C.



The 39 housing authorities designation from HUD met in conference.

The MTW designation grants PHAs the flexibility to design innovative, cost-effective ways of providing federal housing assistance to lowbriefing to Congressional staff. HUD officials also attended and participated in a panel discussion.

During our time in Washington, President Obama released his \$49.3 billion HUD budget proposal for Fiscal Year 2016, which includes funding to expand the MTW program by 15 agencies.

The tour was hosted by U.S. Representative Juan Vargas, 51st District, and SDHC. HUD Western Regional Director Ophelia Basgal joined Secretary Castro on the tour.

Metropolitan Area Advisory Committee on Anti-Poverty (MAAC), which is helping to revitalize the community of Logan Heights. It includes 69 affordable units for seniors (62+) financed in part by \$4,190,000 in HUD HOME Investment Partnerships Program funds granted to

The 9th Project Homeless Connect-Downtown San Diego assisted 1,145 San Diegans on January 28 in a one-day resource fair. This event helped homeless San Diegans rebuild

their lives and provided them with assistance in registering for permanent supportive housing. For the fifth consecutive time, SDHC was lead organizer of Project

Mayor Kevin Faulconer, the Honorary Chair for Project Homeless Connect, spoke and shook hands with homeless San Diegans as they waited in line to enter the event in Golden Hall at the San Diego Community Concourse.
