
SDHC - City of San Diego FY 2022 AHF Annual Plan AHF History





That the SDHC Board of Commissioners recommend that the San Diego City Council take the following actions:

- Approve the Proposed Fiscal Year 2022 Affordable Housing Fund (AHF) Annual Plan (Annual Plan) Program Activity Allocation of \$60,213,486 in anticipated funds (also included in the FY 2022 Housing Commission Proposed Budget) and the proposed Model Programs; and
- Authorize SDHC's President & Chief Executive Officer to reallocate funds among the proposed Model Programs included in the FY 2022 AHF Annual Plan in response to market demands and opportunities.
