

SDHC - City of San Diego FY 2021 AHF Annual Plan Purpose







SDHC - City of San Diego FY 2021 AHF Annual Plan Inclusionary Housing Fund History





- Five-Year Phase In beginning on July 1, 2020










SDHC - City of San Diego FY 2021 AHF Annual Plan Ordinance and Funding Sources




FY2021 REVENUE FORECAST TOTAL: \$67.8M
