A RESOLUTION APPROVING A RESIDUAL RECEIPTS LOAN IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$6,200,000 TO A TO-BE-FORMED LIMITED PARTNERSHIP CONSISTING OF NATIONAL COMMUNITY RENAISSANCE OF CALIFORNIA AND A TAX CREDIT INVESTOR TO FACILITATE THE NEW CONSTRUCTION OF SAN YSIDRO SENIOR VILLAGE APARTMENTS, A 51-UNIT AFFORDABLE RENTAL HOUSING DEVELOPMENT FOR HOMELESS SENIORS, LOCATED AT 517 WEST SAN YSIDRO BOULEVARD; AND RELATED ACTIONS.

WHEREAS, San Ysidro Senior Village Apartments is a proposed three-story, new construction affordable rental housing development located at 517 West San Ysidro Boulevard in the San Ysidro neighborhood that will provide 50 affordable rental housing units for homeless seniors, 55 and older, that will remain affordable for 55 years and one manager's unit;

WHEREAS, on February 9, 2018, the Board of Commissioners of the Housing Commission heard and recommended that the Housing Commission make a loan of up \$6,200,000 to a to-be formed Limited Partnership consisting of National Community Renaissance of California (National CORE), and a tax credit investor, as more particularly described in Housing Commission Report HCR18-018; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Housing Commission that it is hereby authorized to make and fund a residual receipts loan of up to \$6,200,000 to facilitate the new construction of San Ysidro Senior Village Apartments on the terms and conditions more particularly described in Housing Commission Report HCR18-018, including a contingency that the developer receive all necessary third party funding commitments.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President and Chief Executive Officer of the Housing Commission, or designee, is authorized to:

- 1. Execute all necessary documents and instruments to effectuate the transaction and implement the project, in a form approved by General Counsel, and to take such actions as are necessary, convenient and/or appropriate to implement the approvals upon advice of General Counsel;
- Adjust financing terms/conditions as necessary for consistency with requirements
 of other funding sources or to accommodate market changes that may occur,
 provided that the proposed \$6,200,000 maximum Housing Commission loan
 amount may not increase; and
- 3. Substitute approved funding sources with any other available funds as deemed appropriate, contingent upon budget availability, and further authorize the President & CEO, or designee, to take such actions as are necessary, convenient and/or appropriate to implement this approval and delegation of authority by the Housing Commission upon advice of General Counsel.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the proposed development activities set forth in Housing Commission Report HCR18-18 are covered under the following:

The action being taken at this time involves only consideration of a loan. This activity is not a "project" and is therefore not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15060(c)(3). This determination is predicated on Section 15004 of the Guidelines, which provides direction to lead agencies on the appropriate timing for environmental review. This action does not constitute approval of a project. Approval will occur once the environmental review has been completed in accordance with CEQA Section

15004. This action will not foreclose review of alternatives or mitigation measures by the public

as part of the CEQA process. The proposed actions are approval of a loan and do not constitute

approval of the development activity. Future actions to consider and approve development

entitlement approvals related to the development of the site, if applicable, will require additional

review under the provisions of CEQA by the lead agency.

HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) funds and Federal Project-Based

Housing Vouchers constitute a portion of the funding for the project. A final award shall occur

only upon satisfactory completion of the environmental review and receipt by the City of San

Diego of a release of funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development under

24 CFR Part 58 of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). The parties agree that the

provision of any HOME funds and Federal Project-Based Housing Vouchers to the project is

conditioned on the City of San Diego's determination to proceed with, modify or cancel the

project based on the results of a subsequent environmental review under NEPA.

THIS ACTION BECAME FINAL ON FEBRUARY 16, 2018, pursuant to the provisions of San

Diego Municipal Code Section 98.0301(e)(1).
