


WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) announced the availability of \$242,750,000 in Fiscal Year 1999 for a national competition for funds to develop a comprehensive strategy with programs to reduce or eliminate drug related crime in and around public housing developments; and

WHEREAS, the deadline for applications for these funds was 6:00 PM June 16, 1999; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Commission at its meeting of June 4, 1999 authorized the Chief Executive Officer of the Housing Commission to submit an application for \$305,800 for a prevention and intervention strategy at public housing sites including El Camino Real, Pulitzer, Market Street, Santa Margarita, Alaquinas, Calle Primera, Sycamore, Hollister/Grove and public housing neighborhoods in the South Bay, Linda Vista and City Heights areas; NOW,
THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Housing Authority of The City of San Diego, that the submission of this application to HUD is ratified and the Chief Executive Officer or her designee is hereby authorized to execute all documents necessary to receive such funding.

SUBJECT: Application for Funding under HUD's Public Housing Drug Elimination Program (Districts 1, 3, 4, 8)

SUMMARY

Issue: Should the Housing Commission apply for funding under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Public and Indian Housing Drug Elimination Program in order to continue providing services to residents of public housing?

Recommendation 1: It is recommended that the Housing Commission seek Housing Authority approval to authorize the Chief Executive Officer to submit a grant application to HUD under the Public and Indian Housing Drug Elimination Program.

Recommendation 2: If the application is successful, authorize the Chief Executive Officer to execute the documents necessary to implement the program, including amending the agency budget to include any funds received.

Fiscal Impact: A successful application would result in \$305,800 in HUD funding from the Public and Indian Housing Drug Elimination Program, which is not included in the Housing Commission FY00 budget. Total estimated administrative fees of \$54,210 would be available to the Commission.

Previous Related Actions: The Housing Commission has successfully applied for funding under this program on eight consecutive occasions since 1990, for a total of \$2,427,000 to date.

BACKGROUND

A Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) appeared in the February 26, 1999 Federal Register announcing the availability of \$242,750,000 in a national competition for public housing authorities for physical improvements and programs to reduce or eliminate drug-related crime in public housing communities. This application is due June 16, 1999.

DISCUSSION

This year's PHDEP invitation is designed to: 1) encourage housing authorities to establish collaborative relationships and increase services over and above what would ordinarily be provided to residents, 2) coordinate activities with Federal, State and local agencies to increase employment and training opportunities for low-income residents, and 3) increase community and resident involvement in drug and drug-related crime reduction.

Staff proposes to continue a prevention and intervention strategy at public housing sites including El Camino Real, Pulitzer, Market Street, Santa Margarita, Alaquinas, Calle Primera, Sycamore, Hollister/Grove and the surrounding area in the South Bay as well as scattered sites in the City Heights area. The proposal will include the following components: continued employment of professional Computer Coaches and the continued upgrading of the computer systems and networking capability at the Learning Opportunity Centers, reimbursement of law enforcement for additional security and protective services through community policing, drug prevention education, gang diversion, family support services, and youth leadership training and education through collaboration with community-based organizations.

Specific program activities to be proposed in the grant application are being developed through meetings with public housing residents, regular meetings of the Housing Commission's Drug Elimination Team, and collaboration with community service providers and public agencies.

ALTERNATIVES

The Housing Commission could choose not to apply for these funds at this time. If these funds are not received, some of the existing activities would be terminated as funds expire and new activities developed through the application process would not be implemented.


The Housing Authority will be asked to ratify submission of this grant application at its meeting of June 29, 1999. The time frame for application submission did not allow for prior review and approval.
