A RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENT OF THE SAN DIEGO HOUSING COMMISSION BUDGET FOR HOMEOWNERSHIP ACTIVITIES IN FISCAL YEAR 2012 AND AUTHORIZING THE CEO, OR DESIGNEE, TO TAKE SUCH ACTIONS AS ARE NECESSARY AND APPROPRIATE TO IMPLEMENT THE AMENDMENT

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of San Diego adopted Resolution 1529 on June 27, 2011, approving the San Diego Housing Commission's (Housing Commission) Fiscal Year 2012 budget; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Commission requests to amend its budget for Homeownership activities by: 1) adding \$242,505 of Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) carryover and payoff loan funds to site acquisition; 2) transferring \$168,561 from loans and grants to site acquisition; and 3) transferring \$241,391 of excess NSP administrative funds from reserves to site acquisition to allow the Housing Commission to purchase approximately seven single family dwellings and condominiums that have been abandoned or foreclosed in order to resell the homes to eligible low and moderate income first time homebuyers under the NSP; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Housing Authority of the City of San Diego (Housing Authority) that the amendment to the San Diego Housing Commission's budget for Fiscal Year 2012 is hereby approved on the terms and conditions as outlined in Housing Authority Report No. HAR 12-007; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Housing Commission's budget for Fiscal Year

2012 is hereby amended by: (i) adding \$242,505 of Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP)

carryover and payoff loan funds to site acquisition; (ii) transferring \$168,561 from loans and

grants to site acquisition; and (iii) transferring \$241,391 of excess NSP administrative funds

from reserves to site acquisition, for the purpose of purchasing abandoned or foreclosed homes

for resale to first time homebuyers and the rehabilitation of those properties; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the President and Chief Executive Officer of the

Housing Commission, or designee, is hereby authorized to take such actions as are necessary,

convenient and/or appropriate to implement these approvals by the Housing Authority as

outlined in Housing Authority Report No. HAR 12-007; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this action is exempt from the California

Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) of the State CEQA

Guidelines. This activity is also determined to be exempt from review under the National

Environmental Policy Act per 24 CFR 58.34(a)(3).
