San Diego Housing Commission Awarded \$2.4 Million Federal Grant to Assist Homeless and Disabled San Diegans with Housing & Supportive Services

San Diego, CA—The San Diego Housing Commission received a \$2.4 million grant today to provide housing for San Diego’s homeless and disabled population. The Housing Commission will administer the federal grant to six local non-profit organizations responsible for providing supportive services to homeless individuals and families. The grant is part of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development’s (HUD), Continuum of Care program.

The federal grant will continue to fund approximately 200 units of housing with supportive services for homeless individuals with serious disabilities, including mental illness, chronic substance abuse and HIV/AIDS.

“The federal grant assists the hardest to serve homeless individuals and families by linking housing subsidies with services,” said Richard C. Gentry, President & CEO of the San Diego Housing Commission. “This is an important national effort by HUD to reduce homelessness in our cities.”
