



## Affordable housing complex celebrates a new beginning

Las Serenas commemorates its transformation with grand opening

SAN DIEGO – An affordable housing community is celebrating a rebirth.

Formerly known as Delta Village and Villa Serenas, two side-by-side complexes near the San Diego-National City border once featured dirt play areas, apartments with mold, and trash tossed over the fence from next door.

Community HousingWorks, a local affordable housing developer, saw potential for a dramatic makeover. The San Diego Housing Commission helped by providing a \$6.1 million loan and \$9 million in tax-exempt bond financing. With support from City of San Diego Councilmember Tony Young and additional financing from Citibank, National Equity Fund and NeighborWorks America, the \$17.5 million project got underway in June 2005.

Renamed Las Serenas, the 108-unit apartment community serves very low-income families. Onsite services include a 2,100-square-foot community room, computer center and afterschool tutoring. New landscaping, two new playgrounds and security equipment have helped make Las Serenas a safe and welcoming community. Many tenants also had their rents lowered, and tenants will be protected from speculative rent pressure.

A dedication ceremony was held on April 3, 2007.
