## **HOUSING FIRST – SAN DIEGO**

SDHC's homelessness action plan, HOUSING FIRST – SAN DIEGO, has created more than 8,700 housing opportunities in five years for San Diegans experiencing homelessness.

Launched on November 12, 2014, HOUSING FIRST – SAN DIEGO is an effective, diverse funding and housing strategy to create permanent housing opportunities individuals and families experiencing homelessness. The current phase, which began July 1, 2017, surpassed its three-year goal of 3,000 housing opportunities in less than two years.





Established in 1979, the San Diego Housing Commission provides a variety of award-winning affordable housing programs and services that stimulate the local economy, revitalize neighborhoods, and impact the lives of low-income and homeless San Diegans.
