


AT-A-GLANCE CITY OF SAN DIEGO SHELTERS







- Single Adult Shelters serve adults age 18 or older and include beds utilized by San Diego Police Department (SDPD) and the SDPD Homeless Outreach Team (HOT).
- The Harm Reduction Shelter serves adults age 18 or older experiencing substance use disorder or co-occurring conditions.
- Family Shelters serve families with children; data reported above represent households served and households exiting to permanent housing, not individual persons.
- · Youth Shelters include two shelters serving Transition-Age Youth (TAY), ages 18-24, and one shelter serving Runaway and Homeless Youth (RHY) ages 12-17.




Race & Ethnicity of Persons Served – Fiscal YTD



Note: The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) updated data standards effective October 1, 2023, combining the separate race and ethnicity data elements into a single element. Persons who previously reported ethnicity as "Hispanic/Latina/e/o" under the ethnicity data element in addition to selecting a race under the race data element are now identified as "Multiracial."

*Occupancy rates for the single adult shelters do not include beds at the Golden Hall Shelter and Paul Mirabile Center (PMC), both of which Father Joe's Villages operated. Intakes were suspended at Golden Hall in June 2024 to prepare for the program's relocation to an alternate site in December 2024, and intakes at PMC were suspended in July 2024 to prepare for the program sunsetting in December 2024.

Occupancy rates at single adult shelters are lower than usual in December 2024 due to the ramp-up of 130 beds for adults and seniors at the shelter program Father Joe's Villages operates at the Veterans Village of San Diego (VVSD) campus and the addition of 40 beds for veterans, operated by VVSD.
