


#### SDHC - City of San Diego FY 2025 AHF Annual Plan Purpose

HTF Originated in 1990 and Inclusionary in 2003 – Since then:

Affordable Housing Units Created: 9,151

• Affordable Housing Units Preserved: 422

First-Time Homebuyers Assisted: 382

Model programs to which funds are allocated:

#### **Rental Housing Finance:**

- New construction of affordable rental housing
- Preservation of existing affordable housing

#### Homeownership:

- Deferred-payment loans and closing cost assistance
- Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) loans

#### Homelessness activities:

- Prevention and diversion
  - Flexible spending
- Landlord engagement and assistance
- Transitional housing and rapid rehousing





# That the SDHC Board of Commissioners recommend that the San Diego City Council take the following actions:

- Approve the Proposed Fiscal Year 2025 Affordable Housing Fund (AHF) Annual Plan (Annual Plan) Program Activity Allocation of \$39,403,834 in anticipated funds (also included in the FY 2025 SDHC Proposed Budget), of which \$23,119,854 was approved in prior years, and the proposed Model Programs.
- 2) Authorize SDHC's President & Chief Executive Officer, or designee, to reallocate funds among the proposed Model Programs included in the FY 2025 AHF Annual Plan in response to market demands and opportunities.
