The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) is ending funding for the Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV) program five years sooner than expected.

The San Diego Housing Commission (SDHC) estimates that the remaining available federal EHV funding will last until fall of 2026. SDHC will continue to help current EHV families pay their rent until the funds run out.

Our priority is to ensure that you remain connected to resources that can support your transition after your rental assistance ends. To help you during this transition, we encourage you to connect with community resources listed in the SDHC Resource Guide and those listed below to explore your options.

Helps to identify other community-based housing resources for which callers may be eligible.

2-1-1 San Diego

Connects you with a housing navigator and provides referrals to community-based resources and Coordinated Entry Access Sites' registration into the Coordinated Entry System (CES).

Coordinated Entry Access Sites

An Access Site is a starting point for getting connected to available housing resources. Each site differs in what it can provide. Please call ahead to learn more about the options available at the Access Site before visiting their physical location.
